

Notes from the Costume Workshop

Tour of the New Costume Loft Database

On Sunday, October 27th, the Costume Loft became a classroom, as eleven people learned the ins and outs of the Loft's new inventory database program. **Christine Schweitzer**, who has been creating the database, explained the system and the barcode process to **Di Madill**, **Ann-Marie Arneson**, **Marilyn Whitehead**, **Jane Krieger**, **Lynn Cadrain**, **Pearl Arden** and **Sue McCaskill**. **Ned Lemley**, **myself**, and **Erika Schweitzer** (who has been doing the inventory) also attended. Everyone had a chance to try out the software and test the barcode reader – both very simple and intuitive. Christine is creating a user's manual for Loft volunteers and **Langham Court Theatre** borrowers. As the system gets going, we will hold other sessions, if there is demand. Great thanks to **Christine** for this one, and to **Christine and Erika** (and now **Bernard Schweitzer**, as well) for their terrific ongoing work on the inventory and database.

Costume Guild Workshops

Our November workshop on repurposing unfortunately didn't gather enough steam to go ahead. If there is enough interest in the New Year, we may reschedule that one.

Update on the Data Based Inventory Project

Once we get everything needed to carry on business recorded, we'll want to fine-tune the entries with the names of all of you who have created so much of our collection.

Recovery in 2012-2013



The 2012-13 season had audiences which averaged nearly 81% overall - a great improvement over the 65% of 2011-12 (worst attendance in the past 25 years).

Audience

The audiences of *Charing Cross Road* (84.2%), *Lady Windermere's Fan* (92%), *The 39 Steps* (93.24%) and *Calendar Girls* (95%) offset the much smaller audiences of *That Face* (56.48%) and *Better Living* (63.26%) making an average paid audience of 80.81%.

The season reflects the survey of June 2012, which showed that **Langham Court Theatre** audiences prefer to see comedies, followed by musicals, then mysteries or dramas, with "edgy" plays a long way behind. Comedies, mysteries and dramas have a long track record of success with our audiences. However, care may be needed with musicals. For example, *Drowsy Chaperone* (96% in the 2011-12 season), a musical, cost about \$20,000 more to put on the stage than a comedy such as *Calendar Girls* which had the almost identical size audiences (95%).

The difference between the best attended (*Calendar Girls*) and worst attended (*That Face*) means that about 1,900 more people paid to see *Calendar Girls* than *That Face* or about 1,000 more if you exclude the five held-over performances of *Calendar Girls*. 1,000 less people means about \$16,000 less ticket sales.

Dollars

After adding bar, costume rentals, provincial grant etc. (\$109,210) to the ticket sales, **Langham's Court Theatre's** total operating income (excluding grants) for the 2012-13 season was the highest ever. After paying for everything, there was still more than \$30,000 left over which we can hope will peacefully remain in the bank awaiting the results of the 2013-14 season.

Summary

So was 2012-13 a great success? – 81% attendance was the best since 2005-6 (which averaged 65%) and broke the continuous downward trend of the previous 5 seasons. Two of the shows had very low attendance compared to the other four. The average attendance of 81%, compared to the previous season's less than 65%, exceeded the budget and contributed a surplus of \$30,000 to the coffers.

Board Changes

At the beginning of November, **Diane Briggs-Hoyle**, who had been appointed as a Member-at-Large to replace **Heather Jarvie**, resigned from the Board. 
