



Get ACTivated

Langham Court Seeks Two Additional Theatre Companies To Compete in ACTivate 2014.

ACTivate, a festival for inspiring theatre - is a one-act, adjudicated play festival being held April 4th to 6th, 2014 at **Langham Court Theatre**. The festival brings together local theatre companies to nurture their artistic development, further the education of emerging performers, and showcase the talent that exists in Victoria's volunteer theatre community!

Langham Court Theatre has confirmed its official entry to the festival will be *Red Herring* by **Bill Adams** and directed by **Chris Moss**. However, members and non-members are invited to submit proposals independently for the two remaining spots. Companies entering the Fringe stream of the competition must be based in Victoria, BC. They can be not-for-profit or professional and must provide their own stage manager. Plays must be original works (never previously published or produced for money). The plays should be approximately 45 minutes in length and no longer than an hour. Companies will also participate in the festival workshops. The winner of the festival will have a guaranteed spot in the **Victoria Fringe Festival**, August 21st to 31st, 2014 at the **Langham Court** venue. There is an **ACTivate** entry fee of \$100. The Fringe entry fee will be paid by **Langham Court Theatre**.

Deadline for submissions is February 27th, 2014. The two spots will be determined by lottery on Feb 28th, 2014.

What Do Our Volunteers Do?

Rosencrantz and Guildenstern are Dead

By Tom Stoppard
Directed by Keith Digby and Cynthia Pronick
Production Dates: June 12th to 28th, 2014

Tom Stoppard's *Rosencrantz and Guildenstern Are Dead* tells a story of two minor characters from *Hamlet*, highlighting the fundamental incomprehensibility of the world with his typical witty existential repartee. Rosencrantz and Guildenstern spend the entirety of the play in total confusion, lacking even such basic information as their own identities. The play ultimately suggests that the prominent role of chance in our lives, coupled with the difficulty of discerning the true intentions and desires of other people, leads to almost paralyzing confusion. It is also very funny.

Stoppard borrows heavily from **Shakespeare**, not only re-imagining the play's plot but also quoting directly from *Hamlet* whenever his Rosencrantz and Guildenstern characters speak to Claudius, Gertrude, Hamlet, or Polonius.

Characters:

Rosencrantz (M 30s): a carefree and naïve personality masking deep dread about his fate.

Guildenstern (M 30s): although frequently confused by the world around him, he is a deep thinker who believes that he can understand his life.

The Player (M ageless): the leader of the Tragedians has a cunning wit and confident air.

Tragedians (M 12-80): a group of travelling male actors specializing in sensationalistic performances, including sex if the price is right.

Hamlet (M 30s): thrown into a personal crisis with the death of his father, he appears to be going insane.

Claudius (M 45-60): sinister King of Denmark and Hamlet's uncle.

Polonius (M 45-60): Ophelia's father and shifty adviser to the King.

Gertrude (F 45-60): Queen of Denmark and Hamlet's mother, she sincerely hopes that Rosencrantz and Guildenstern can help her son.

Ophelia (F 30s): Hamlet's former beloved who spends the play in a state of anguish over his bizarre behaviour.

Requirements: The play relies on actors who have wit, energy and, with rehearsal, the ability to speak Shakespeare's language comfortably.

Auditions will be held in the **Main Lounge** Saturday, March 15th and Sunday, March 16th from 1:00-4:00 p.m. Call backs will be held Monday, March 17th, 7:00-10:00 p.m.

Audition pieces will be made available with the scripts at the theatre. Choose a piece that you feel you can deliver with energy and clarity, and prepare it for your audition. Memorization is not necessary, interpretation

Novelist Philippa and her assistant Daphne are seeking refuge from a mysterious follower they fear may be the notorious "Norfolk Strangler". Hot on their heels come TV historian Quentin Danesworth and vacuous honeymooners Robert and Miranda. The uninvited guests are soon snooping around the secret passages of the creepy old mansion and asking too many questions for comfort. Sure enough, one by one they fall victim to violent deaths by devious techniques — no secret panel is unoccupied, no cup of tea untouched, and nobody is who they appear to be. Cicely Venner (30s to 60s): Lawyer from what was the Tomb family's solicitors. Professional, friendly with Hecuba, but hiding secrets.

Happy Valentine's Day! Originally written for the stage, the film version of *What Happened Was* won the **Sundance Grand Jury Prize** at the **Sundance Film Festival** in 1994. The rarely performed stage adaptation is every bit as quirky, insightful, and humorous as the acclaimed film. This is a first-date encounter story like no other, in which two co-workers find unlikely common ground in what at times is more of a surrealistic joust than a date. The "real-time" progression of the story draws us into the awkwardness and openness of each second. There is a heightened theatricality about this piece that makes ordinary life magical, offering an irresistible perspective on those confounding moments when we feel inspired, desperate, or obligated to make connections with others.






The Friends of the Library Spring has Sprung Book Sale
