

January 15-31, 2015 People Directed by Tony Cain

This production is challenging. It needs a large cast, often all on stage at the same time and frequently performing in different areas up, down and off-stage at once. Keeping your attention focused in the right place requires considerable directorial skill and strong acting talent.

Tony Cain, with his company of players and crew, are enjoying this challenge. Now that we're onstage, we can begin to tackle some of the more difficult aspects of the play. This involves many actors moving props and people about the stage, meticulously choreographed and set to music in order for the end results to appear elegant and effortless rather than chaotic and shambling.

Our designer, Anne Swannell has been labouring for many months to create the desired effect of one of the stately homes of England in both its decayed and re-embodied form. We have had the usual teething problems you'd expect to occur in any community theatre venture. The clash of work, pre-booked trips, and last minute cast changes have to, somehow, be worked

into the schedule, but People had something else to accommodate – CHRISTMAS! Despite the fact that we have known about this break in the build-up to our opening in mid-January, the reality of an abrupt halt for two weeks at a crucial stage in rehearsal put nerves on edge. Will we be able to regain the momentum we've been nurturing for four months in the space of two short weeks? We hope so.



### **Artist Spotlight**



### The Mystery of Edwin Drood

**Charlie Aitken**: 60, a genial man married to Mattie Fae and hen pecked for 38 years


**Little Charles Aitken**: 37, socially awkward and clumsy

**Rosie Pye:** Late 20's to mid-30's. A nononsense yet passionate young woman. Pages 40-46

**Mercy Lott:** 50-60. A kind and goodnatured spinster, plain, somewhat prim and would dearly love to be Flora. As a result, she is almost slave-like to Flora's needs. Pages 1-9, 56-59, 32-34

**Jim:** 55-65. Gardener and bee-keeper of the Humble estate-wise with a quiet and unassuming demeanour. Pages 9-12, 25-27

# Introducing the Stage Management Guild

The Stage Management Guild is a group who are interested in the stage management aspect of Langham. Not all stage managers are in the group, and not everyone in the group actively stage manages. Our experience with Langham ranges from none to "several seasons." Some are self-taught while others have degrees in theatre.

We meet every couple months for a few hours in the evening. Our discussions frequently revolve around safety issues and we've proposed to the Board the creation of a Langham-wide Safety Policy. Our first workshop on Blocking was very well received, and we are planning on running another workshop before this season is over.

We're looking for those interested in helping outline Langham's first Safety Policy. Our workshops are open for anyone interested (though there is limited space) and will be publicized through the newsletter. Meetings are a good place to bring specific questions you may have if you're new to stage managing and want to get involved.

Our next meeting will be Tuesday, January 13 at 7p.m.. We have a Dropbox where we post our meeting notes and other useful resources. We are Langham oriented, but are not exclusively associated with Langham.
