Stepping up to Stepping Out!

"Geoffrey sticks out like a sore thumb" says Mavis, the tap dance instructor in the upcoming production Stepping Out. I play Geoffrey, the one guy in a cast of ten, the "sore thumb."

Stepping Out is a lighthearted, smart, insightful play written by a man who cares very much what his characters say – and do not say. In Geoffrey's case, it's mostly the latter. Actually, being the only guy in a play about a tap dance class for adults is a lot like when I often was the only guy in a local tap dance class for adults which I attended for several years.

Richard Harris, the playwright, obviously did heaps of reconnaissance while developing his characters: nine gals, all charming in an off-the-cuff sort of way, and one awkward guy with a penchant for drifting toward the back of the class and avoiding anything which might be mistaken for an opinion.

If I were to write a survival guide for the "outnumbered man," it would surely include such headings as: costumes resistance is useless; politics – keep your head down because it's all men's fault anyway; kids – you know nothing... and they're all men's fault too.

In personalities and experience, in both dance and stage, the play is well cast. Adult classes of whatever subject, are always salted with variety. The mix here gives the play an affectionate charm. It reminds me of my own tap class days when I was the awkward, outnumbered guy drifting to the back seeking camouflage. But the hours of seemingly futile class exercises and routines always produced year-end performances to be proud of.

Escape From Happiness

Escape From Happiness is a very funny dark comedy set in working-class Toronto in the late 1990s. It tells the story of Nora,

the matriarch of an eccentric, wacky family. Her daughter Mary Ann is a crazy runaway mother, her son-in-law Junior is a beat-up car thief, and her daughter Elizabeth is a hot-tempered bisexual. Nora maintains a cock-eyed optimism with a cup of tea and a firm grasp on fantasy, as the family deals with cops, drug dealers, and thugs in the basement.

CHARACTERS:

None of the characters can be described in a few words, they're like real people and are full of inconsistencies. Read the play to find out more.

Nora (50s): Motherly, sweet-natured, scattered, tends to ramble on and on

Elizabeth (30s): Strong-willed, determined, swears a lot, not afraid of physical combat.

Tom: (50s) A former cop, violent streak lurks underneath, a loner who loves his family.

Mike (40s/50s): A cop, tough, kind of what you'd expect a cop to be.

Junior (20s): Gail's partner, a bit stupid, but sweet and well-meaning.

Rolly (50s/60s): Self-declared pornography king, Steve's dad, just trying to make a living.

Steve (20s): Rolly's son, soft-hearted, guileless, tries hard to please Dad.

Mary Ann (20s): The middle daughter, terrified of her father, a bit obsessive.

Dian (30s/50s): A cop, charming, sly, dishonest.

Where There's Smoke...

I bought two actual, honest-to-goodness, real-deal prop cigarettes! They're designed for stage and screen so they don't have a blue or green glow like the lesser-effective e-cigarettes I can't return because they're "tobacco products".

The two cigarettes I've ordered work the same way an e-cig works, but there's no nicotine or other toxins in the vapour. They come with a realistic looking cigarette package that doubles as the charger and houses the spare cartridges. As long as the cartridges are available, we can use them over and over again.

No more powder puffers... no more herbal cigarettes... no more nicotine e-cigarettes... no more trouble with patrons... no more problems for actors.

Squarespace. With shipping, the two cigarettes and a package of 10 extra cartridges is a little over US\$100, but considering how many productions can use them in the future, I think it's a good deal.

CALL FOR NOMINATIONS

for Board positions to be elected at the AGM on Sunday, January 31, 2016 at 7 p.m.

The Victoria Theatre Guild and Dramatic School's Annual General Meeting will be held on January 31, 2016. There are four positions on the Board of Directors that are up for election:

Secretary (two-year term)

Responsibilities include conducting correspondence on behalf of the Board, preparation and custody of the minutes of all general meetings and Board meetings, being a signing officer.

Treasurer (two-year term)

Responsibilities include administration of the financial affairs of the Society including banking, payments, collection of funds or delegation thereof; maintenance of proper accounting / financial records; preparation of financial statements; membership on the Finance Committee; being a signing officer.

Member at Large (two-year term)

Responsibilities include involvement in one or more committees and other duties as assigned by the Board.

Member at Large (two-year term)

Responsibilities as above.

You must be a member in good standing (i.e. have your membership fees fully paid up by the AGM) both to run for a position and to nominate or second a person for a position. If you are not certain of your membership status, please check with the box office. You can also renew your membership on or before the date of the AGM through the box office.

Karrie Ayotte has been appointed Nominations Chair. To put forward your name for one of the four available positions, or to nominate another individual for one of the positions, please contact Karrie. Advanced nominations will be accepted up until 6 p.m. on Friday, January 29, 2016. Nominations will also be accepted from the floor during the meeting. For each nomination, please provide the following:

- a) full name of the person being nominated;
- b) position for which the person is being nominated as a candidate;
- c) full names of the nominator and seconder; and
- d) confirmation that the candidate, nominator and seconder are all members in good standing.

Each candidate must have both a nominator and a seconder. At the

AGM, nominators will be given a brief opportunity to speak to their nominations; candidates will also be given a brief opportunity to speak to their nomination. Voting will be by secret ballot and no proxy voting is permitted (in other words, you must be present at the AGM to vote).

The current Secretary (Andrea Pite) and current Treasurer (Andrew Lee) have both indicated their willingness to stand for reelection to those positions.
