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


Each nomination must be received by the Nominations Chairperson by 6 p.m. PDT, June 18, 2017 and must include:

Have you ever wondered what a lighting hang and focus is? Does it sound like a foreign language when those lighting folks say, "that frensel needs to

be yoked up," or "the cool Source 4 in area 3 needs to be tilted up"?


The goal of this lighting and focus workshop is to set up a "house hang" that Langham can use throughout the season for rentals, and teach those who might want to help but be too intimidated to come out. There will also be some introductory lighting design theory.

Discussion will begin Tuesday, June 27, 6–11 p.m. We want to get to know what level of knowledge you have and start to bring everyone up to the same speed. We'll develop your vocabulary so you can make sense for the hang and focus on Wednesday, June 28, 10 a.m.–6 p.m. This is where we put up the ladders and then the lights.

Wear clothes you don't mind getting dirty and, if you can, bring an adjustable wrench.
