
Art Show News

She Stoops to Conquer was first presented at Covent Garden Theatre, March 15, 1773. It concerns Kate Hardcastle, a young aristocratic lady who poses as a servant girl to win the heard of a young gentleman too shy to court ladies of his own class. A number of delightful deceits, misunderstandings and hilarious turns of plot must be played out before the mating strategies of Kate and her friend Constance conclude happily.

The script has been adapted for the play to be set in 1922.

We have been successful in obtaining a grant of \$18,000 from the Victoria Foundation to operate a "Learning Opportunities Program" here at Langham. The intent of the program is that all Langham Guilds will run a program or

workshop that addresses an interest of that Guild. The workshops are also a vehicle to provide genre-specific training for upcoming productions. Finally, there is a two week summer day camp for young people entitled, "Let's Make A Play."

While the program is intended to benefit Langham members, some participant space will be made available to the wider community as an outreach activity. If there's a cost, those holding an active Langham membership will receive a discount, and in some cases, the first chance to register.

By the end of 2016, we expect to conduct 24 or more "Learning Opportunities"

(workshops). To date, through email submissions and three "town hall" sessions, members have provided their ideas. These ideas will inform the program selections. Program selections will be made in consultation between interested
