During the run of *The Penelopiad*, which ends on May 10th, the Art Show will feature the works of Adam Lloyd Cook.

Adam is a Victoria-based artist, although he was born in Scarborough, Ontario in 1964. Both Adam's parents were artists, so it is no surprise that he also has pursued an artistic career. While attending **Spectrum Community School**, Adam received inspiration and training from art teacher and accomplished artist **Harry Stainbridge**. Adam went on to study animation as well as drawing and painting.

Adam's current technique involves finding a piece of comic art or other image that stimulates and motivates him, changing the colours and dialogue (or eliminating it), and altering it to the way he wants to see it painted.

Adam's work has been seen in various Victoria coffee shops, tattoo parlours, artists' cooperatives, and restaurants, including the artist-friendly **Cabin 12**, where he is currently showing his work

Ken Horn was born in Scotland, studied art in Sweden, and at **Croydon Art College** in England before coming to Canada in 1975 where he spent a year studying art conservation in Ontario.

Initially working in black and white Celtic designs, he then spent a season or two working in clay. However, from about 1997 to the present he has been concentrating mainly on the use of acrylics.


Want to Design a Set But Don't Know How?

Words of Wisdom to Would-Be Volunteers




Boeing Boeing is a farce in two acts – it is set in Bernard's "bachelor pad" in Paris in the 1960s.






