

Charles' art is represented in Austria, Denmark, England, France, Germany, the Netherlands, Hong Kong, Ireland, Japan, Malaysia, Norway, Scotland, Singapore, the USA, and in five Canadian provinces. He specialises in botanical watercolour done on both paper and canvas








Diane Adolph




