
Toes are Tappin'

About the Author, John Patrick Shanlev

Shanley is the author of more than 23 plays, which have been translated and performed around the world, including 80 productions a year in North America.

His play *Doubt: A Parable* won four 2005 Tony Awards (including Best Play), the Drama Desk Award (including Outstanding Play) and the Pulitzer Prize for Drama. Shanley directed the 2008 film version, which starred Meryl Streep, Philip Seymour Hoffman, Amy Adams and Viola Davis. The screenplay was nominated for an Academy Award, and the film won the Writers Guild of America Award for Best Screenplay Written Directly for the Screen.

Female Transport tells the journey of six women convicted of petty crimes in 19th century England and sentenced to a life of hard labour in Britain's overseas penal colony (present day Australia). During the six-month voyage, they are kept in a cramped cell below deck where they learn to overcome their past and individual prejudices and grow into a unified group of hardened fighters in order to survive the journey. Sexism, classism, altruism, oppression, and repression punctuate this story of survival and solidarity.

We are looking for actors who are comfortable with working-class British dialect. Many of the characters require movement and stage combat. While experience is not necessary in these areas, all actors must be comfortable with close proximity to other actors and physical performance.

All actors should prepare one monologue of their choice in middle or lower class British dialect for auditions. Please bring your actor resume and headshot as well.

Sarge (35-55): A hardened sailor, abusive and cruel.


Captain (50s/60s): An old Army Captain, in it for the money.


"Just before I retire..."

I often say I'm going to retire and return to Langham Court. I did shows here during the early part of my career when I was still learning my craft. Memorable was a production of *Boeing*, *Boeing*, directed by Toshik Bukowiecki, the first time around. I think the review read "the play was very funny... although at times the actors found it funnier than the audience". An early lesson about the effect of opening night audiences... I have learned a few things since then.

Most recently, through the Story Theatre Company, I have partnered with The Royal BC Museum on several special productions. The latest is a WW1 Centennial commemoration using the

letters from B.C. soldiers found in the Archives. We mixed the letters with period songs and slides in a tight 30-minute story theatre-style production.

Heritage Canada is sponsoring a tour of *The Call Went Out* to eight different communities in B.C. First up is The Royal B.C. Museum on Remembrance Day. We hope to see you at this free event in the main hall of the Museum this November.

then choose the number and type of tickets you want. If it is a 2-for-\$ night (Preview and Tuesdays) then it will accept pairs of tickets or combine other

categories in to pairs. We limit the total number of tickets on an order to eight because if you order ten or more a Group Rate applies, for which you can call the Box Office.

You cannot (yet) pick the actual seats but you can choose the area of the theatre where you would like to sit (Front, Centre, Rear or Upper) and specify any special request such as requiring an aisle seat.

Then you fill out you contact information specifying your first name, last name, phone number, and email address. This data is required so we can find your account to book your seats and send an email confirmation. If you use a browser, such a Chrome, these fields may be "auto filled" for you making the process foolproof.

Finally, you click on the "PROCEED TO PAYMENT" button. This takes you to a separate payment page where you fill in only your credit card number, expiration date, and the CVV (that security number on the back of your credit card). All other data is taken from the order page. Once your payment has been approved you will receive, by email, a credit card receipt with details of your order and a message that your order has been submitted to the Box Office for processing.
