




Open for business October 3rd to 20th

84 Charing Cross Road is directed by Sylvia Rhodes, Produced by Vinnie Chadwick and Stage Managed by Penelope Harwood. Other members of the Company include: Corinna Gilliland as Assistant Director, Bill Adams as Set Designer, Chad Laidlaw as Lighting Designer, Alan MacKenzie as Sound Designer, while Peta MacKenzie is in charge of costumes. Sally Crickman is working her magic with the Stage Décor and Jean DeCartier is in charge of Props, Paul Gillan is the invaluable ASM, and newcomers Wumi Awofala and Hazel Wilkins are Assistant Producer and Assistant Costume Coordinator respectively.
