

Veronica Stewart



From April 24th to May 11th, during the run of *Better Living*, the featured artist will be **Veronica Stewart**. If you wish to meet the artist, Veronica will be in the lounge on Sunday, April 28th from 1:00 to 3:00 p.m.

The collection of jewellery and paintings is a new collaboration of art forms for Veronica. Painting has always been a part of her creativity but this year she found a need to explore the medium further and began by using pieces of bronze embedded in the work, which led to the photo-montages. It has been a great pleasure to her put her jewellery pieces on display with the new paintings and she hopes to be able to

pursue this combination of passions in the coming years. Veronica worked as a ceramic artist for 20 years before discovering silver in the form of Precious Metal Clay. As she became more fascinated with working on this smaller scale, she gradually spent more time making jewellery, and is now working exclusively as a jewellery artist. Crocheted and knitted fine wire and chain are combined in her work with silver and semiprecious gems to create the pieces in her collection. In a similar fashion, she has combined small details of photographs with acrylic paint on canvas to create the semi-abstract images in her artwork.

Audience Survey Results

A survey during the run of *The Foreigner* last season came up with the following statistics:

Shows they like

As far as shows are concerned, it showed that the audience preferences are as in the table below. The "Other" category included 17 described as "variety" and the rest single requests for specific plays or authors.

These numbers could indicate that the Victoria Theatre Guild audience would like to see approximately:

- 2-3 Comedies each year.
- 1-2 Musicals each year.
- 1-2 Dramas each year.
- 1 Mystery every 1- 2 years.
- 1 Edgy every 5 6 years.

This excludes the "other" category, which is assumed to be distributed in roughly the same proportions.

How They Found out about Langham Court Theatre

The last table shows where people found out about the shows:

Looks like getting more subscribers and word of mouth are the most effective ways to increase the audience. **Times Colonist**, the **Langham Court Theatre** Season Brochure and **Monday Magazine** seem to be about one-third less effective. The "other" category includes mostly one-offs like neighbour, **CBC**, **Royal Theatre**, poster, etc.

Costume Guild Workshops in March

On Saturday, March 16th, **Louise Osselton** helped **Leyla Mitchell**, **Lynn Cadrain**, **Ann-Marie Arneson** and me adapt period patterns for 1920s cloche hats to go with the 1920s flat-folded dresses some of us made in Louise's January workshop. It was a full afternoon of sharing ideas, fitting and designing our hats. Enormous thanks to Louise for her patience, expertise and wonderful sense of collaboration!



And on Sunday, March 17th, **Chris Stusek** led an enthusiastic group in a free-for-all ideafest on repurposing. **Leyla Mitchell** turned two old T-shirts into a 'new' dress and got started on two other projects, **Lynn Cadrain** turned a dress into a lovely new top, I made a summer shirt for myself out of a man's shirt, **Ramona Scott** revised a dress to make it more wearable (and colourful), **Chris** got started on turning a knit turtleneck dress into an elegant jacket, and **Ann-Marie Arneson** helped everyone with fitting, inventing and what-iffing. Huge thanks to Chris for a most inspiring and entertaining afternoon!

Costume Guild Workshop: Basic Millinery

The Basic Millinery workshop is scheduled for Sunday, April 21st, 12:00 p.m. to 4:00 p.m in the Costume Workshop.



Professional milliner **Tierre Joline** will be leading participants in creating a fabric hat. This workshop is already fully booked, but if you would like to be added to a waiting list, please let me know. The final Costume Guild workshop of the season, in June, on zippers, is partially booked. Please see the website for more information, and RSVP soon if you would like to attend.

On Pins and Needles

We have a lot of needles and pins to discard on a regular basis, from use in the Costume Workshop, and via donations. I'm happy to report that we now have a disposal solution – and an invitation.

It's not safe to dispose of needles, pins and straight razor blades in garbage, the CRD doesn't take them in the blue box program, and none of the sewing stores or CRD-recommended metal recyclers in town accept them. The Recycling Council of BC recommends disposal in sharps (hypodermic needle) containers. The box contents are treated as biohazard waste, and incinerated.

In March, for a nominal fee (includes the box and the recycling fee), we purchased a box from the Cook St. Rexall Pharmacy for the Costume Workshop. Even this small box will take a long time to fill, so if our sewers don't already have access to a sharps box, please take advantage of this one as a safe and responsible way to dispose of bent and dull needles (hand and machine), pins (including glass- and plastic-headed) and straight razor blades. Please either give me a call, or leave your items, safely packaged and labelled, by the Costume Workshop door, if it's locked.



Please only deposit needles, pins and razor blades, and please don't close the lid. Thank you!

Recycling Fabric Scraps and Thread

In finding a way to responsibly dispose of our needles and pins and blades, I also found a recycling stream for fabric, ribbon and thread scraps. Ordinarily, those would go into garbage, but the **Women In Need (WIN)** donation centre on North Park takes them as part of its textile recycling, to be processed into things like carpet underlay. We'll start a bag in the Costume Workshop for those bits and pieces, and we encourage anyone else who is doing a lot of sewing to donate to WIN as well, if you don't already, to keep those materials out of the landfill.

Final (?) Words on Those Scissors

My comments in last month's issue about the endless saga of the scissors were not intended to cast aspersions on anyone working backstage. My apologies to the props folks, who may have been using the scissors without knowing that they didn't belong up there.

And ... prior to our workshop on March 16th, we hunted down one of the pairs of good scissors in the women's dressing room. Please, folks, do not remove the blue-and-black-rubber-handled scissors from the Costume Workshop. There are lots of other pairs. Thank you.
