Congratulations to our most Recent Life Members

The two new comers to the Wall of Fame or Rogues Gallery are Bill Adams and Vinnie Chadwick who have demonstrated over and over that they are extremely creative, energetic and hard working – welcome additions to the Life Member roster.

Bill Adams

Bill was initially hired as Production Manager in August 1997. The job entailed supervising set construction and deconstruction and ensuring that the facility be well maintained. However, it was soon apparent that Bill was not only doing the job for which he was hired, but was making himself indispensable in a variety of ways around the theatre. While working as Production Manager, he also spent many volunteer hours designing and codesigning sets such as those for Money and Friends, Tartuffe (co-designed with **Dick Stille**), *Jitters* (another co-design with Brian Lenton), Blood Brothers (co-design with Toshik Bukowiecki) and Mother Courage, building and painting sets including those for I'll Be Back Before Midnight, Loves of Cass McGuire, Loot, Night of The Iguana, Money and Friends, Tartuffe, Blood Brothers, The Heiress, Death of A Salesman, Blithe Spirit, Betrayal, Barefoot in the Park and Mother Courage.

In 2000 Bill left Langham Court and it took two individuals to cover the work he had done on his own. Fortunately for us, however, he returned to the theatre and resumed working as a volunteer, not only designing, building and painting sets but acting on them as well. As an actor Bill appeared in Hotel Sorrento, The Dining Room, A Will to Kill For and A Pack of Lies. Some of the sets Bill designed as a volunteer since he returned in 2001 include The Dining Room, An Inspector Calls, The Lion in Winter, Rebecca, Racing Demon, Lady's Not For Burning, Scotland **Road** (remember that amazing change from iceberg to hospital room and back again), Enchanted April, The Long Weekend, Midsummer Night's Dream, Isn't It Romantic, A Shot in the Dark, Jacques Brel is Alive and Well and Living in Paris and, of course, The History Boys. In addition Bill has worked on the construction and painting of the majority of sets that have been on the **Theatre Guild** Stage since 2001. In addition, Bill designed and built the period desks for *The Prime of Miss Jean Brodie* (which ended up as museum pieces), he painted the portrait of Agatha Christie for A Party to Murder, he also did a number of original paintings

for the set of *The Noble Spaniard*, he did the fireplace carving for *Maggie's Getting Married* and the stained glass window for *The History Boys*.

As if that wasn't enough to ensure Bill his place as a Life Member, he also worked on poster designs for several productions and he was the one to recommend that we turn the Lounge into an art gallery during productions. His idea was taken up and he became our first Artistic Co-ordinator from 1997 until May 2000. Unfortunately for us, *The History Boys* set will be Bill's last for a while as he intends to take a sabbatical. However, we are optimistic that he will return soon refreshed and ready to work his magic on our stage once more.

Vinnie Chadwick

Vinnie was first seen at **Langham Court Theatre** in 1979 when she and husband Michael arrived here from Edmonton. However, with two small girls at home plus the start-up of a new business. Vinnie had little to do with the Theatre Guild until Michael first became treasurer in 1982. It was soon apparent from Vinnie's contributions at club nights and Board dinners that she is an amazing chef. So it was no surprise that **Michael Tyler** persuaded Vinnie (along with his wife **Anne Tyler**) to host the first of our annual Christmas dinner parties in 1984. Vinnie, with help from friends and family continued to cater the Christmas parties for the next four years. It was in large part through Vinnie's efforts that the tradition of the Guild Christmas feast has stayed with us to this day. Since then, Vinnie has offered her amazing cuisine at 17 or more Christmas dinners. In December 1998 Vinnie along with eight other volunteers (including daughters Narissa and Anna) made wreaths to decorate the theatre for the Christmas do.

In January 1988, right after her fourth stint as the chief Christmas Party host, she served as Costume Co-ordinator for *Rose*. She acted as Costume Designer for *A Chorus of Disapproval*, the November show in the following season. Immediately after the show closed, Vinnie was

busy hosting her fifth Christmas party. By this time the parties had become so popular that more and more individuals were called upon to contribute their culinary skills. With others to fill the void, Vinnie took time off as a chef until December 1992 at which time she not only fed us but entertained us on stage as well. At the same time she worked as Costume Designer for *The Real Thing* in January 1993, and for *What I Did Last Summer* in April 1993. She also designed the costumes for *To Grandmother's House We Go* in November-December 1993 and *Lettice and Lovage* in May-June 1994. She has also designed costumes for *Racing Demon*, *Maggie's Getting Married*, *Here on the Flight Path*, *Party to Murder* and *A Shot in the Dark*.

It was in 2004 that Vinnie first became a Producer. In that capacity she has worked on *The Lady's Not For Burning*, *School For Scandal*, *Maggie's Getting Married*, *Artichoke* and *Picnic*. She also worked on set décor for *Maggie's Getting Married* in June 2006 and *Artichoke* in November 2006. As well as feeding us and clothing us, Vinnie has been a tireless worker at all the Open Houses and at every single Costume Sale where her knowledge of fashion has made her indispensable.
