

Readers' Theatre

Over the past three years, **Langham Court** has seen a most encouraging growth of **Readers' Theatre.**

Readers' Theatre is essentially radio with an audience. The actors do not have to be off book, nor do they move much, preferring to sit on wonderfully comfortable stools, scripts on music stands, relying almost entirely on voice. The interaction with the audience is intimate and friendly. Three years ago, Luke Krayenoff introduced Readers' Theatre to Langham Court and invited directors and actors to participate. Initially Luke was director, actor and producer until a solid base of support was established. It wasn't long before that happened and Toshik Bukowiecki took over the task of producing, followed very rapidly by Joan Patrick.

For the past two years, **Joan Patrick** has been the mainstay of **Readers' Theatre**. Joan became Producer, Narrator, Stage Manager, Props, Sound Effects and, with **Alan MacKenzie's** assistance when the company moved into the auditorium, Lighting Designer. Alas, Joan has recently moved to Ottawa, leaving very large shoes to fill.

Langham Court and the members of Readers' Theatre

thank Joan very much for her lasting contribution to the **Theatre Guild's** alternate theatre.

For the first two years, the two one-act plays were performed before relatively small audiences in the lounge on a Saturday night, four times annually. You CAN Stage Manage!

CITT/ICTS Rendezvous 2011 is taking place right here in Victoria this year!

This is a wonderful opportunity for those of us that work behind the scenes in theatre. The conference takes place at both the Royal Theatre and the **Victoria Conference Centre** from August 9th to13th. One of the workshops being offered on Saturday, August 13th from 4-5:30 p.m. is called **You CAN Stage Manage**, and for the low a 'la carte price' of \$50, is a steal for the tricks of the trade you will take away with you!

Course Description:

When someone asks you to stage-manage a show, does your stomach drop? Do you think "That's way too much work, I don't know how, and its far too complicated." Your busy life probably does not allow you time to do formal training - but this workshop will show you some of the tricks of the trade to simplify and demystify stage management. You will leave with some valuable tools, such as the most efficient SM Notebook, the "list" that will replace all of your paperwork, quick tricks for setting up backstage and effective ways of organizing scene changes.

Course Instructor:

Debora Johns has over twenty years of stage management experience including *Phantom of the Opera*, Opera Lyra, Ottawa, National Arts Centre, Stratford Festival, Manitoba Theatre Centre, Neptune Theatre and Pacific Opera, Victoria.
