

A Broadway Musical comes to Langham Court Theatre!

The third show of this season is *The Drowsy Chaperone* – a Broadway musical. Plus, it's Canadian. This was a multiple Tony Award winner in 2006 and is a major event in the Langham Court Theatre calendar. *The Drowsy Chaperone* began as a stag party spoof for two Toronto actors, Bob Martin and Janet Van De Graffe, and morphed into a Broadway and West End hit.

The play is conjured by an eccentric recluse, The Man In The Chair, who loves the big Broadway musicals of the 1920s. He leads us into his delightful world of song and dance as *The Drowsy Chaperone*, a wildly crazy 1928 musical, comes to life in his apartment. As The Man In The Chair might say: "Everybody loves a wedding, right? Well, that's what this show is – a musical journey through a wedding day gone awry. But don't worry, this isn't one of those big modern musicals where the bride and groom are torn apart by gang warfare or flying monkeys, and there's no flashy spectacle like landing a helicopter on the stage to distract from a lack of proper melody. It's the 20s, and the tunes are wonderful! But if you enjoy that flashy kind of show, don't worry – we do have gangsters, and dancing monkeys with little cymbals, and an airplane – but it's all very tasteful and fun! That's exactly what this show is – fun!"

Introducing Leading Canadian Producer, Director and Choreographer Jacques Lemay

Jacques Lemay has been described as one of Canada's



most talented and versatile Producer, Director and Choreographer Jacques was Artistic Director of the Opening Ceremonies for the **1988 Calgary Olympics**; Producer and Director of the **1989** and **1991 Jeux Canada Games**; Producer and Director of the **1994 XV Victoria Commonwealth Games**; Producer and Director of the **1997 Special**

Olympics World Winter Games; and Producer and Artistic Director of **Bridge Fest** for the Opening of Confederation Bridge in Prince Edward Island.

His creative work spans the full gamut of theatrical and television productions including operas, ballets, symphony concerts, musicals, multi-cultural productions, royal galas, variety shows and special events. Mr. Lemay was the Artistic Director of the **Charlottetown Festival** from 1991 to 1997 and was Founding Director of the Modern Jazz Dance department for the professional and general schools for the **Royal Winnipeg Ballet**, a position he held for thirteen years from 1976 to 1989. He has directed and choreographed musicals and operas in several major theatres across Canada including The Manitoba Theatre Centre, Grand Theatre, London, Toronto's O'Keefe Centre, Winnipeg Opera Association, Pacific Opera, Victoria, **Bastion Theatre**, **The Citadel Theatre**; and many more. He had the great honour of being selected as Artistic Director for six Royal Visits held throughout the country. He also gained renown as choreographer for the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and other international dance companies. His services have been retained as a consultant, teacher,

adjudicator and advisor by government agencies; arts organizations; theatre and dance companies; First Nations organizations, and colleges; including Canada Council for the Arts, B.C. Arts Council, Manitoba Arts Council, Saskatchewan Arts Council, Yukon Arts Advisory Council, Cultural Human Resources Council, Pan Am Games and the Office of the Auditor General.

Jacques has served on many Boards of Directors across Canada. He is the Past Chair of the Advisory Committee for Marketing and Planning for the National Capital Commission in Ottawa. He served as the Vancouver Island Director for the Celebrate Canada Committee for the Department of Canadian Heritage. Jacques was recently named Community Arts Leader of the Year and is a recipient of the **Queen's Jubilee Medal** for his work in arts and culture. He was the staging director for the Unveiling of the New 7 Wonders of the World in Lisbon, Portugal with such stars as Ben Kingsley, Hilary Swank, José Carreras, Chaka Khan and Jennifer Lopez. Jacques was also selected as a member of the Opening and Closing Ceremonies Team for the 2010 Vancouver Winter **Olympics**, and was Creative Advisor to the Executive Producer. Also in 2010, Jacques and his wife, Director/Actor, Janis Dunning were named CFAX Community Arts Leaders of the Year.

Jacques recently retired as Co-Director of the **Canadian College of Performing Arts**, which he founded along with wife and co-Director Janis in 1998. Jacque's reason for retiring? To pursue a freelance career which so far includes (apart from choreographing *The Drowsy Chaperone*), a oneman show with opera singer **Ken Lavigne**, which has been developed by both Jacques and Janis. Then when his stint with Langham Court is finished, he will be choreographing *Carmen* for **Pacific Opera**, and shortly after *Carmen*, he will be off to Alberta to direct *CATS the musical* for **Theatre**

Calgary. Not only a sensational Choreographer and Director, Jacques is also very much in demand, and we are all thrilled to have him working with us **at Langham Court Theatre**.

I am sure the changes were made with the best intentions, but we are and will always be, **Langham Court Theatre**. *Michael Tyler*



December Workshop: Tea and Vogue Pattern Magazine

On Sunday, December 11, several steadfast Costume Guild members took over a corner of the Lounge and had a first crack at



embers took over a corner of the Lounge and had a first crack at our collection of 164 issues of *Vogue Pattern Magazine*. The afternoon flew by. The issues from the 1970s and 1980s were more hilarity than nostalgia, but nearly every issue offered something for our new electronic archive of articles: techniques, fitting and altering, textiles and equipment, working with specialty fabrics and stitches, couture tips, tailoring ... the list includes 113 titles so far, and we didn't get through half of the issues. I'll also make it available as a searchable electronic document.
