

### **KEVIN EADE** Assistant to the Director



# About the Novelist

Jane Austen (December 16,1775 – July18, 1817) was an English novelist whose works of romantic fiction, set among the landed gentry, earned her a place as one of the most widely read writers in English literature. Her realism, biting irony and social commentary have gained her historical importance among scholars and critics.

Austen lived her entire life as part of a close-knit family located on the lower fringes of the English landed gentry. From 1811 until the release of Sense and Sensibility (1811), Pride and Prejudice (1813),


1816, with the release of *Sense and Sensibility* (1811), *Pride and Prejudice* (1813), *Mansfield Park* (1814) and *Emma* (1815), she achieved success as a published writer. She wrote two additional novels, *Northanger Abbey* and *Persuasion*, both published posthumously in 1818, and began a third, which was eventually titled *Sanditon*, but died before completing it.

# About the Playwright



Janet Munsil lives in Victoria and is the Artistic Director of Intrepid Theatre, where she produces Victoria's Fringe Festival and Uno Fest. Her plays include *The Ugly Duchess, Emphysema (a love story), Be Still, Circus Fire, That Elusive Spark, Influence,* and a new play for young audiences, *I Have Seen Beautiful Jim Key,* which will premiere in 2015. Her work has been seen across Canada, in Prague, and throughout the UK, including the

Soho Theatre in London's West End. She is the BC Islands National Forum Rep to the Playwright's Guild of Canada, has been a member of the Banff Playwright's Colony and the Stratford Festival playwright's residency, and served on the jury for the Siminovitch Prize in 2013. *Pride and Prejudice* was commissioned in 2012 by Theatre Calgary and the National Arts Centre (Ottawa) and premiered as a coproduction in both cities that autumn. She applauds Langham Court Theatre for making a home for Miss Austen and other women writers in their current season!


IAN SIMMS Charles Bingley








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# **Art Exhibition**
