That is why we do what we do.



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Director's Notes

Gothic Melodrama is a weird and wonderful world to visit... but we wouldn't want to live there. Choosing which skull is right and how much of an autopsied dead woman we really want to see, how loud the screams should be, etc., reminds us of the real world depicted in *Dr. Jekyll & Mr. Hyde*: the late Victorian mix which straddled the outwardly upright upper middle classes and the seamy, dangerous streets and alleys of Whitechapel.

R. L. Stevenson's 1886 classic anticipated Jung's Dualism and Freud's theory of the structure of the mind by a few years, and the real life evil of Jack the Ripper by just two. It is part horror story and part social document, reflecting, as it does, the Victorian mix of good manners, and hidden behaviour that indulged dark desires.

It is fun, though... deciding how to play the "real" world of that time of extremes, how much drama, how much melodrama, and how much comedy, and we have been accompanied while steering the tricky seas of this voyage by an excited, willing and able design team, cast and crew. For their talents and seemingly indefatigable spirit, we thank them.

We hope you enjoy our mixture of fog and fun, death, depravity and light drama. Cynthia Pronick and Keith Digby


PAUL HILTON Lighting Designer


ARIEL GLIDDEN Assistant Stage Manager

About the Playwright



JEFFREY HATCHER

In 1886, Robert Louis Stevenson's novella *The Strange Case of Dr. Jekyll and Mr. Hyde* presented a jarring and horrific exploration of various conflicting traits lurking within a single person. Jeffrey Hatcher's adaptation in 2008 has been called "hipper, more erotic, and theatrically intense...definitely not your grandfather's Jekyll and Hyde," and was nominated by the Mystery Writers of America for an Edgar Award for Best Play.

Jeffrey Hatcher is fast becoming one of the most prolific and frequently produced playwrights in the U.S., and he recently adapted his acclaimed stage play Compleat Female Stage Beauty for the screen. He wrote the screenplay Casanova and Boys Don't Cry and has also written for the Peter Falk TV series Columbo and E! Entertainment Television.

His many award-winning original plays include *Three Viewings* and *Scotland Road*. Hatcher wrote the book for the Broadway musical *Never Gonna Dance* based on the Fred Astaire Ginger Rogers film *Swingtime*, and co-authored the stage version of the bestseller *Tuesdays With Morrie*.


ALEX CARROLL Surgical Student

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
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
