Director's Notes

Jackson writes an immensely touching and layered story of a once vibrant intellectual "changing" into an irrational man. It is at once poignant and funny. The story of Alzheimer's disease is a compelling and horrific one to all involved. But Jackson has found a way to see the humour in the lives of the family as they scramble to cope. He creates an ingenious mechanism by which we can see the former lucid man and the gradual leave-taking of sanity. Set against the background of King Lear, we see many parallels between Eliot's family of three daughters and Lear's struggle with his daughters. It is a rich comedy. 
JOYCE KLINE Set Decor


About the Playwright

NAGLE JACKSON

An actor, director and playwright, Jackson's career has spanned six decades. He was raised in Seattle, the setting of *Taking Leave*. He has authored several plays, adaptations and translations which have been produced at leading theaters throughout the U.S., from American Conservatory Theater, Oregon Shakespeare Festival and Seattle Rep in the West, to the McCarter, Kennedy Center and New York's Intar Theater in the East. Several of his plays – *Taking*


Leave, The Quick-Change Room, A Hotel on Marvin Gardens, debuted at The Denver Center, for which theater he also created several translations from the works of Molière. His play The Elevation of Thieves was prize winner in the Onassis Foundation International Playwriting Contest, an award presented to Mr. Jackson by the President of Greece in Athens, 1998. Mr. Jackson was Artistic Director of both the Milwaukee Repertory Theater and the McCarter Theater. He continues to direct as a guest artist with theaters throughout this country and in Europe. He has been a Master Director with The Directors' Company in New York for several years. Mr. Jackson resides with his wife in Princeton Junction, New Jersey but has fond memories of visiting Victoria and having tea at the Empress.

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Charles Dool

nitially I specialized in botanical watercolour, whether the background was empty, a wash, real, or abstract, on either paper or watercolour canvas, but while the "rut" was comfortable, I decided to explore other ways of painting and now also use acrylic. I often prepare the surface with drywall mud to texture the base. I also sometimes finish off an acrylic painting with watercolour, then protect it with an acrylic spray to seal it. Variety is usually rewarding.

My art is represented in: Austria, Denmark, England, France, Germany, The Netherlands, Hong Kong, Ireland, Japan, Malaysia, Norway, Scotland, Singapore, USA and five Canadian Provinces.

Charles Dool

John Janzen

John Janzen was born in Ottawa in 1954. He moved to Alberta at a young age and spent most of his life skiing, building houses, breeding Newfoundland dogs, and running engines for CN through the Canadian Rockies. His need to create and express himself evolved during quiet moments on lengthy layovers between shifts. Watercolour was his chosen medium in the midst of these scenic adventures because of its portability and convenience.

In 2001, Janzen enrolled at the University of Alberta Extension program and began refining his style and skills as a painter.

In 2011, Janzen re-located to Milan, where he studied Italian and continued his art education at NABA School of Art and Design. He travelled throughout Europe pursuing the works of great masters like Caravaggio, Michelangelo, Rubens, Modigliani, and Soutine. These works inspired a shift to oil painting.

After moving to Victoria in 2013, Janzen has been inspired by the power and movement of the ocean. He is especially attracted to how boats are time worn and weathered, and how everything is eventually destroyed by the incredible power of the sea.

This show is the first opportunity Janzen has had to display and share his oil paintings.

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


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












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
