



PEARL ARDEN

About the Playwright



David French is one of Canada's most popular and critically-acclaimed playwrights. He was born in Coley Point, Newfoundland on January 18th, 1939. He is perhaps, best known for the Mercer family plays: *Salt-Water*

Moon, 1949, Leaving Home, Of The Fields, Lately and Soldier's Heart. His backstage comedy, Jitters, has been performed all over North America and most of his plays have had successful international runs. In 1989, David was inducted into the Newfoundland Arts Hall of Honour and in 2001, he was appointed an Officer of the Order of Canada. This is the fifth of David French's plays produced by the Guild, the other four are Leaving Home (1973), Of The Fields, Lately (1989), Jitters (1998) and That Summer (2009).

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

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


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
