



Director's Notes

This play examines the nature of guilt and responsibility. Penelope wears the guilt, but is it really HER fault? Is it the fault of Eurycleia, the slave, whose envy of 'the pretty ones' erupts into a bloodthirsty vendetta? Is it the fault of the suitors, whose actions rendered the maids 'unclean' and an intolerable pollutant in Odysseus' household? Is it the fault of Telemachus, who reluctantly obeys his father's command? Or is it the fault of Odysseus himself, whose absence necessitates the secret ruse to which only Penelope and her faithful maids are privy, thus making their subsequent actions open to misinterpretations? Penelope is placed in an intolerable position, where whatever actions she takes, someone will suffer. Ultimately she alone wears the crown of guilt forged by the actions of many, including herself.

Despite its serious theme, this is a very funny play! Some of the humor didn't become obvious until we started acting it out in rehearsals. I've highlighted Margaret Atwood's sly and knowing wit wherever appropriate; after all this is a modern re-telling of an ancient work of fiction and the sky's the limit. Another directorial choice has been to expand the definition of 'maids' to include ALL maids. Maids are not only young maidens, they are maids of all ages: maids who work as slaves, as servants, or even as the gilded wives of kings.

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About the Playwright



Leading Canadian novelist, Margaret Atwood was born in 1939 in Ottawa and spent most of her childhood in Northern Ontario and Quebec. She was a student at the University of Toronto; and in an interview on CBC, some years ago, she recalled, with great pleasure, the classes she took from the late, great Northrop Frye when she was an undergraduate at Victoria College.

Margaret Atwood's career as a writer began in 1964 with the publication of a book of poetry, *The Circle Game*, for which she won the Governor-General's Award. Five years later, in 1969, her first novel *The Edible Woman* was published as well as a second book of poems entitled *The Animals in That Country*. Since then, Ms Atwood has published many novels including *The Handmaid's Tale*, later turned into a film scripted by Harold Pinter, and *The Blind Assassin* winner of the 2000 Booker Prize. She has also written many short stories, children's books, collections of poetry, critical studies, and scripts for radio and television as well as editing works of both fiction and non-fiction. *The Penelopiad* is Ms. Atwood's first stage play.

The book is for sale, for \$25 (tax included), at the theatre in either the lobby or the lounge (during show times) or at the box office during office hours.


