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
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Directors' Notes

About the Novelist



JANE AUSTEN

Jane Austen (1775–1817) is known primarily for her six major novels, which interpret, critique and comment upon the British landed gentry at the end of the 18th century. Ms Austen picks apart a society where the only hope for a secure future for a woman of "no fortune" was to marry well, where gossip was the lifeblood of society and where reputations were both built and destroyed by rumour and innuendo. Sense and Sensibility (1811), is the first of her major novels, and was followed by Pride and Prejudice (1813), Mansfield Park (1814) and Emma (1815). She wrote two additional novels, Northanger Abbey and Persuasion, both published posthumously in 1818.

About the Playwright



KATE HAMILL

A hundred-dollar bet with a friend started Kate Hamill's playwriting career. In 2010 she was an aspiring actress becoming frustrated by looking at casting notices that all seemed to call for long-suffering girlfriends or bikini babes. "I got swiftly irritated by the dearth of good female roles in female-centric stories," Hamill said recently. The friend was Andrus Nichols, co-founder of New York's downtown Bedlam Theatre Company. Sense and Sensibility, her wildly energetic hundred-dollar-bet-winning adaptation of the Jane Austen classic, was

produced by Bedlam Theatre in 2014. Her balance of high theatricality and strict adherence to story, theme and sentiment won her acclaim with audiences, critics and the Janeites alike. Soon, other projects followed, including adaptations of Thackeray's *Vanity Fair* and Austen's other great, *Pride and Prejudice*. In 2017 her "kinetic concoctions" raised her into the top ten list of playwrights produced in America for that year. Hmmm... a hundred dollars risked, from which Kate Hamill, Bedlam Theatre, and theatre producers all over North America have benefited immensely. Enjoy the mayhem.



About the Music

As with some of Fanny Mendelssohn's compositions, published first under her famous brother Felix's name, Jane Austen's name was not attached to her novels.

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
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


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

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Wendy Merk

Wendy started drawing pictures as soon as she could hold a pencil. In those days her subjects were her mother and Olive Oyl from the 'Popeye' cartoons on television.

In her teens Wendy discovered theatre. She was able to combine both interests in her costume design paintings, some of which will be part of the art show at Langham.

Wendy truly appreciates the opportunity to display her work along with that of her friend and colleague Jean Topham.

Jean Topham

Jean trained as a paper conservator at the Bodleian Library in Oxford, England. On returning to Canada she set up a paper conservation program at the Vancouver City Archives. She then moved to Victoria where she has worked as a private paper conservator for the last forty years conserving everything from family memorabilia to Emily Carr works of art on paper. She is currently a consultant for the B.C. Land Title and Survey Authority.

Jean was greatly influenced by the work of Lorne Loomer and his use of cedar bark brushes and ink. After experimenting with these brushes and ink Jean started using brushes drawn from nature – lavender, heather, reeds, daffodil leaves and fungi. Combining natural brushes, Chinese ink and watercolour or gouache Jean produced the work in the current exhibition.



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
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
