John Mason

John's artistic practice explores figurative painting through using varying levels of visual information to convey emotion, setting, and mood. His work examines how colour, gesture, and form can combine to add specific character to the figures, and how the background and negative space can support, interrupt, or change the reading of the figures. Outside of painting, John can be found performing with Langham Court Theatre, VOS, and Raino Dance, as well as writing for victoriapinkpages.ca.



Richard Stille

Richard has been involved with Langham Court Theatre for the past 22 years as a director, lighting designer, stage designer, mediocre actor and board member. At this time last year, Richard directed *Proof* as the final show of the 2016-2017 season. Other Langham credits for directing include *Dancing at Lughnasa*, You're a Good Man, Charlie Brown, Moon Over Buffalo and Tartuffe.

Richard photographed with film in the U.S. through the 1980s, but took a hiatus when he returned



to pursue theatre directing. For the last five years, he has stepped up his practice with digital photography, learning new



camera techniques and a totally new approach to post processing. Armed with more flexibility, he has been applying the same focus used in his theatre practice, his writing, and his previous clinical psychology practice, exploring images in ways that encourage the viewer to employ a new perspective in how they interact with the world.

The display is hopefully logically separated into differing parts of the world, differing display mediums and differing points of perspective. Enjoy!

Playwright in Residence Program

Langham is pleased to announce its annual Playwright in Residence Program. Each season, one local playwright will come on board with two major tasks to complete: write a play and produce up to four 'Cabaret' evenings which will include readings of scenes from works in progress by new and emerging Victoria playwrights.

Jason Vikse will be the inaugural Playwright in Residence. Watch this space

Jason Vikse is a Canadian author and playwright. He published his first book in May 2012 and has since published six more, including comedies, a short story collection, and a fantasy series, some

of which have peaked in the Top Ten lists on Amazon.com. He has also written a number of plays, one of which premièred in Zürich in 2016. When he isn't writing, he directs, acts, and designs for the theatre. Jason has directed or performed in twenty-five productions in three countries over the past dozen years, including directing the recent production of *The Clean House* at Langham.

Playwrights' Workshop and Mentorship

Playwright/director Janet Munsil, whose play *That Elusive Spark* is part of our 90th season, will lead a weekend workshop in playwriting in the late fall. MIKADO IN THE FALL

When considering *The Mikado* for this year's production, the Victoria Gilbert and Sullivan Society's Board felt it was essential to present it in a culturally sensitive way while remaining true to Gilbert and Sullivan's comedy and social comment.

Director Heather-Elayne Day brought to the Board an exciting vision for *The Mikado*, inspired by a production of the New York Gilbert and Sullivan Players.

After consulting with Asian-American art leaders to build an inclusive cast and creative team, NYGASP created a prologue that sets the scene in the context of Gilbert and Sullivan's Victorian London, all while upholding The Mikado's characters, storytelling, themes and satire of human nature. In the prologue real-life people in Gilbert and Sullivan's world the actors of the D'Oyly Carte company and D'Oyly Carte himself! – interact with the writing duo as they are planning their next show. These friends and colleagues come to life in Gilbert's imagination as he dreams them into the characters of his next great production, The Mikado.

The Victoria Gilbert and Sullivan Society will be the first company to licence this new prologue for our production.

Show times are November 2, 3, 4 at the Dave Dunnet Theatre in Oak Bay and November 9, 10, 11 at the Charlie White Theatre in Sidney. Evening and matinees available on both weekends.
