

ELECTIONS CONUNDRUM AT THE NOVEMBER AGM

As President of the (newly renamed) Langham Court Theatre Society, I need to inform the membership about a problem that has arisen from our recent bylaw amendments that were passed at the Summer General Meeting. In order to be compliant with the Societies Act, we changed the timing of our future AGMs to occur within the same calendar year as our fiscal year end. Our next AGM is scheduled to occur this coming November. This is a good change for the Society in most respects, except that we failed to notice a conflict arising from our bylaw 6.1 (2), which reads as follows:

The timing of the elections for the Board is as follows:

- (a) At each Annual General Meeting, half of the officers of the Board, will be elected for two-year terms, on a staggered basis as follows:
 - (i) In **odd** calendar years, the President, Vice-President and two Members-at-Large will be elected and serve for two consecutive years; and

(ii) In even calendar years, the Secretary, Treasurer and the other two Members-at-Large will be elected and serve for two consecutive years;

The problem arises from the fact that the last AGM was in January 2018 and the next AGM will be in November 2018, both occurring in even calendar years. Thus, according to the bylaw the Secretary and Treasurer positions should be up for election this year, and the President and Vice-President positions next year, even though the Secretary and Treasurer will have been in office less than one year and the President and Vice-President will have served almost three years by the time of the 2019 AGM. We can amend the bylaw at the coming AGM to resolve the ambiguity going forward, but we need to decide how to proceed at this year's AGM.

I invite all members to send an email to boardpresident@langhamtheatre.ca with their thoughts on this matter. I will forward all emails concerning this matter to all members of the board, in order to inform our discussions at the September and October Board meetings.

Audition Requirements:

- Digital headshots and resumes are required to be sent in advance to producer.
- Bring a song of your choice (verse and chorus or short excerpt), no more than two minutes from similar show, or same composer, or contemporary musical theatre repertoire.
 - Please Note: do not sing from the show! Successful singers will be asked to sing a selection from the show for callbacks only.
 - Your selection should show your vocal abilities and range. Tip: look for up-tempo, character songs and/or songs that use character voices.
 - Bring music sheet in right key, in binder, double-sided. Cuts and edits (if any) clearly marked. An accompanist will be provided.

- NO ACAPELLA SINGING.

Callbacks will be a group event and include music and sides from the show, a dance call, and an improv session. Sides and music will be provided for those invited to callbacks. No previous dance experience required.

Notes: Scripts are available through the Box Office for \$10 which is reimbursed when script is returned. The Box Office summer hours are Monday – Friday 10 a.m. to noon.


