I am hoping to hear from individuals who are interested in directing, assistant directing and producing shows at Langham Court Theatre over the next season.



Auditioners will be reading from selected scenes. Sides (short, selected scenes for audition purposes) are available on the Langham website and at the Box Office. Reading at the call backs will be from the entire script.

English accents are preferred but not required. Note: although the four characters were opera singers, no actual singing is required.




