## I AND YOU



# UPDATING THE LANGHAM PLAY SELECTION PROCESS

At the June 2014 Summer General Meeting, the role of the Production Chair (PC) was revised. No longer a voting member of the board, the PC's term was extended from two years to three. Removing Board responsibilities was to give the PC greater freedom and focus to plan and select two seasons versus one. The responsibilities of the PC are numerous, and include:

- selecting the plays for two seasons;
- selecting directors;
- assisting with the assembly of production teams;
- selecting poster images for the season;
- mediating conflicts; and
- bringing issues to the board that require resolution.

The amount of work post season selection can be challenging, and incoming PCs often are not aware of the level of commitment needed.

A recommendation was made to review this change after a few years to determine its success. The board has reviewed the play selection process and the role of the PC in an effort to make sure the role


is efficient, supported, successful, and of course desirable.

Based on our review, the Board will be proposing eliminating the administrative responsibilities of the PC, allowing the position to focus on artistic vision. The PC will select (vs manage) the season and choose directors, with the help of the Play Selection Committee. The PC will be reintegrated back into the Board and be known as the Play Selection Committee Chair (PSCC). There will be a present PSCC and an incoming PSCC added to the Board.

The next incoming PSCC would immediately, upon their election or acclamation, become a voting member of the Board, vice-chair all meetings of the Play Selection Committee for the next year, and would become PSCC in the second year of their term.

We would like to invite you to a **Town Hall meeting on Sunday April 5 from 4 to 6 p.m.** to provide an opportunity for feedback and input from the membership regarding these proposals. There would be a **Special General Meeting held on Sunday June 28** to vote on the required amendments to the Bylaws in order to implement the new play selection process.
