SYNOPSIS & DIRECTOR'S NOTES

This absurd, romantic comedy is set in a mythical town that is not really, but Almost, Maine. The residents love entanglements are revealed in nine absurdist vignettes all about falling in and out of love that comes with tears, pain, anguish, and joy. These stories are about love that is found, lost and broken. Their love for each other comes in many shapes and forms from large garbage sacks, bits and pieces of a broken heart in a little paper bag and a tricky painting. Cariani gives a version of love that has elements of the sureal that blurs into absurdity. There is the ever present Aurora Borrealis, a magnificent light show that excites and stimulates the lovers with magical moments of shooting stars, distant planets and a bewitching celestial aura. I am most grateful to Wayne Yercha, Alan Penty and the Langham Board for giving me the honour to be part of the reopening of the Langham Theatre. This production could not have been possible without the most diligent Langham Production Team who always go above and beyond and I have been blessed with a bold, bright and brilliant ensemble cast consisting of veteran performers and VadArts drama students who have been a constant source of inspiration throughout the process.




