
Performance Dates: May 10 - 28, 2023

Arden Rose is a Victoria, BC artist working in Acrylic & Collage. She has lived in B.C. most of her life and spent a great deal of her childhood running

wild in the hills on the outskirts of Kamloops. With an Economics degree from the University of Victoria and an MBA from McMaster University, she began to explore her creative side after establishing a mainstream career.

Mainly self taught, she has been influenced by the expressionist movement, and Modigliani.

Beauty is in the eye of the beholder and Arden sees beauty in the natural world, old buildings, and in the human form. All contribute to her inspiration. Her work ranges from impressionistic portraits to bold landscapes and florals. Rose easily captures both joy and wonder and she is a colorist at heart. "I love colour, dream in colour, and live and breathe it, chasing delight, joy, spirit, and momentary beauty."

Rose is a past member of the Gage Gallery and currently shows her work in a number of venues including the Art Rental and Sales program at the Art Gallery of Greater Victoria and the Tofino Gallery of Contemporary Art. She is a member of SPAC and the Victoria Arts Council, and owns and operates The Fairfield Art Studio.

### A Thank You from the Flamenco de la Isla Society

What a treat to experience flamenco on the Langham stage and see the audience rise with shouts of olé in a standing ovation! Thank you to all who helped raise funds to support the Victoria Flamenco Festival in July!

Highlights included a guitar rendition of Asturias by Spanish composer Isaac Albéniz, played by Juan de Marias and Gareth Owen, and danced beautifully with castanets by Veronica Maguire. Gareth showed his talent in an intricate guitar solo and accompanied the cante (singing) and baile (dance) of the other artists. All gave a passionate and spirited performance! Lia Crowe amazed the crowd by masterfully handling a manton

(shawl) and bata de cola (long skirt with a train). Estelle Kurier danced from her heart, a dramatic Farruca with a hat, and Carolyn Crampton captivated everyone with her percussive footwork and elegant arm movements.

A display of flamenco fashions gave attendees a chance to learn more about this vibrant art form. The silent auction raised close to \$1,400 with donations from local businesses and flamenco friends.

This co-production between Langham Court Theatre and the Flamenco de la Isla Society showed the power of community. We hope it is the first of many such events!

This performance concluded a six-month rehearsal process that was coordinated with film and TV training classes.
