

### Art show in the Lounge

After graduating in graphic arts, and spending 20 years in the business world, Graham Scholes focused on the fine arts field. Watercolour was his medium of choice for 25 years.

Over the past years, Graham has approached his art career with, "I wonder what if." This manifested itself in photography, paper sculpture, metal sculpture, and watercolours. In this mix was the importance of drawing the live model,



the old masters' discipline. Woodblock prints, with a mix of waterless lithography, kappazuri and reduction printmaking, have captured his attention for the past 29 years.

His lighthouse series of woodblock prints is an interesting example of engaging his audience. He decided on a series of images of lighthouses on the coast of British Columbia. Graham recognized that the lighthouse structures belong to history; however, the background/foreground belong to his imagination.

He has created over 85 prints for a variety of subjects. Now at a heart beat from 90, he might slow down but not retire, as his work keeps him young. "Artists don't retire, they draw to conclusion."

### **LCT GARDEN NOTES**

Well, here we are nearing the end of a long, hot summer and possibly heading into a long, hot autumn. Researching a few of the plants in Langham's gardens, I find a global representation of hardy plants that thrive in sunny situations. In the central bed Phlomis russeliana (Turkish sage) is vying for territory with Prostanthera (Australian mint bush). The Phlomis is the large-leaf plant with collars of yellow flowers at intervals along its vertical spikes. By now and through winter the dried spikes are striking features in the garden or in flower arrangements. The Prostanthera is evergreen with tiny, scented, dark green leaves and a froth of tiny white flowers in late spring. I've just learned that it is used as a culinary herb and tisane in Australia. Representing the Americas, Stipa tenuissima, (Mexican feather grass) is graceful and very soothing to watch as it sways with the slightest breeze, and Verbena bonariensis (Brazilian verbena).






Don't think hanging baskets - this is the stick insect of Verbenas! It's tall and rangy with pops of purple at its tips. It self-seeds liberally and seems to grow everywhere except Lise's garden. One website now calls it an invasive species, but I still love it.

PEARL ARDEN is both the heart and the backbone of our small group. She's always first on duty and among other tasks, makes it her mission to give the plants their weekly soaking. Pearl's been with Langham for most of this century, working tirelessly in many areas, notably costuming, and was a founding member of this gardening group. Her calm presence and sage observations are treasured by us all and her ginger cookies are delicious! Neither we, nor the garden could do without Pearl.


