After graduating in graphic arts, and spending 20 years in the business world, Graham Scholes focused on the fine arts field. Watercolour was his medium of choice for 25 years.

Over the past years, Graham has approached his art career with, "I wonder what if..." This manifested itself in photography, paper sculpture, metal sculpture, and watercolours. In this mix was



Bov. Local theatres have been in as well getting ready for upcoming plays. It's great to be in full swing again.


