

Free Monologues Workshop

January 13, 20, and 27 10 am to 1 pm each session

Co-Production Chairs Jacqollyne Keath and I will be facilitating this free workshop to help actors prepare audition monologues.

The workshop will be limited to 10 (ten) participants and will require the participants to prepare two contrasting monologues. They will be required to present their first monologue on the first day of the workshop (January 13) to all participants. Jacqollyne and I will spend some time working with each participant and make recommendations on how to improve their monologue.

The second day of the workshop (January 20), the participants will present their first monologues again followed by a brief discussion of their work. Then they will present their second monologues and repeat the process of the previous week.

The final day of the workshop (January 27), will be the presentations of the second monologues again, followed by a brief discussion of their work. The workshop will wind up with a discussion of the experiences for the participants, their recommendations for further workshops and their evaluation of the workshops.

As the afternoon wears on, these five very different women joyously discover a common bond in this wickedly funny celebration of women's spirit.

Synopsis:

Nicholas Dunn presents a world structured on a capitalist ideology that nurtures status, greed and excess, where more is never enough, as opposed to the greater good.

Three desperate characters seek refuge in a seedy motel room after stealing a painting from a museum. Tension and nervous energy build as they make ludicrous attempts to evaluate the art piece. The contentious bickering over its value quickly descends into chaos and a violent conflict.

Characters:

Zoey: 20s, 30s – Possesses a clear vision, yet applies street smarts to navigate complex situations while managing the group's relationship dynamics.

Ian: 30s, 40s – lan is decisive and driven, stands his ground firmly, and challenges authority. Operates independently and is intense, resolute, and assertive.

Victor: 20s, 30s – The younger sibling of Zoey, Victor has a tough exterior and harbors a gentle core or displays an almost juvenile demeanor.

McEvoy: 50s, 60+ – An established art curator, McEvoy is shrewd but rational – passionate about restoring a family heritage lost in World War II.

Artists from diverse backgrounds and marginalized communities are encouraged to participate in our auditions. The stated age groups and genders are merely suggested for the characters by the playwright; all are welcome to audition.

Playwright Olena Astaseva (she/her) was born in the city of Kherson (Ukraine), which

she considers her hometown to this day, although she is currently living abroad until it's safe to return. She studied at the Kyiv Institute of Culture. Olena is the author of many short stories. Several of her plays have been shortlisted for the Ukrainian Contemporary Play Week festival, and were staged

in the theatres of Kherson and Kyiv. Olena is also a founding member of the Theatre of Playwrights in Kyiv. *A Dictionary of Emotions in Wartime*, has been read in dozens of countries. In August 2023, a short film of the same name based on this play, directed by Leah Loftin, premiered in the United States.

BACKGROUND

On February 24, 2022, Russia invaded Kherson. The battle ended on March 2, 2022 with the capture of the city and a pocket of land on the right bank of the Dnipro River by Russian forces. Kherson was the first major city, and the only regional capital, to be captured by Russian forces during the 2022 invasion. On November 11, 2022, the Armed Forces of Ukraine liberated and recaptured Kherson.

The Russian Armed Forces withdrew and retired to the left bank, with their attacks on Kherson continuing to this day.

Of the pre-war population of 300,000, only around 50,000 remain in Kherson today. Many families from Kherson and other Ukrainian cities have found refuge on Vancouver Island. Help

Ukraine Vancouver Island Society (HUVI) was founded in 2022, and is a volunteerled organization supporting nearly 1,500 displaced Ukrainians across Vancouver Island. Together with partner agencies, HUVI assists displaced Ukrainians in creating decent and safe new lives for themselves and their families. <u>https://ukrainehelpvi.ca</u>

Anastasiia Konstantynova (she/her,) playing the role of Olena/Matvei, is originally from Avdiivka, Donetsk Oblast (Ukraine). She has a bachelor's degree in physics from Donetsk National University. She arrived in Victoria in May 2022, and has been employed by HUVI since December 2022 and volunteers with the Ukrainian Cultural Centre. She
