

Character Requirements:

All roles are open to all, regardless of race, gender variance, and ethnicity.

Most roles require British Accents, and intensive vocal coaching will be provided.



- Garry Essendine (M 35-55) A selfobsessed famous London actor; age 40*; he dreads getting old and losing his appeal but in reality fears being alone; British accent (RP) required; has several monologues.
- Liz Essendine (F 30-50) Garry's wife (they've been separated for years, but she is still in his small circle of friends); stylish/poised, kind, witty, pragmatic; in her 30s; theatrical producer/writer; British accent (RP) required.
- Morris Dixon (M 35-55) Garry's theatrical manager and friend; in his late 30s; smart, romantic; in love with Joanna; British accent (RP) required.
- Henry Lyppiatt (M 35-55) A successful businessman; Garry's longtime producer and friend; husband of Joanna; proper, proud, slightly pompous but oblivious; about 40; British accent (RP) required.
- Joanna Lyppiatt (F 25-45) Wife of Henry; in her early 30s; attractive, glamorous, cunning, self-confident, seductive; British accent (RP) required.

- Monica Reed (F 35-55) Garry's tolerant secretary and confidante; organized, sharp-witted, patient, pleasant but also austere; in her early 40s; British accent (RP) required.
- Daphne Stillington (F 18-30) A pretty debutante; quirky, astute, slightly naïve, but ambitious; ardent admirer of Garry; age 24; British accent (RP) required.
- Roland Maule (M 20-35) An earnest, aspiring playwright; obsessed fan of Garry; slightly unstable, odd, nervous; wears glasses; in his 20s; British accent (RP) required.
- Fred (M 25-45) Garry's valet; unrefined, laidback, easygoing; Cockney accent required.
- Miss Erikson (F 45–65) Garry's chain-smoking housekeeper; slowmoving, strange; attends séances; Swedish accent required (can be doubled with Lady Saltburn).
- Lady Saltburn (F 55-75) A wealthy aristocrat; dignified but sometimes effusive; aunt of Daphne.
