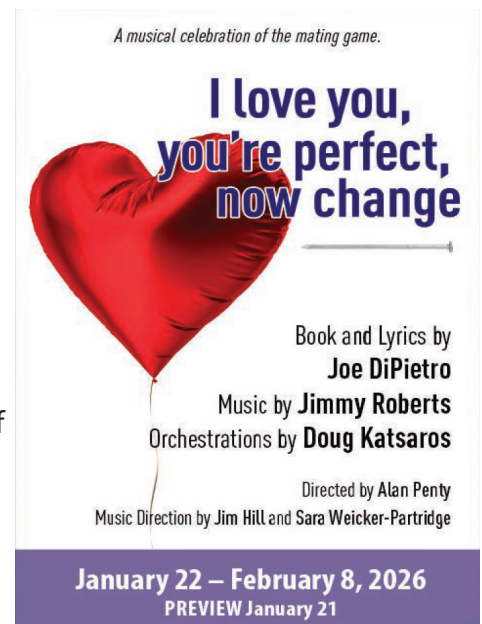

Sunna – (late teens, early 20s) She inherits her uncle's mortuary and becomes the town's mortician, a rebel, and an outcast

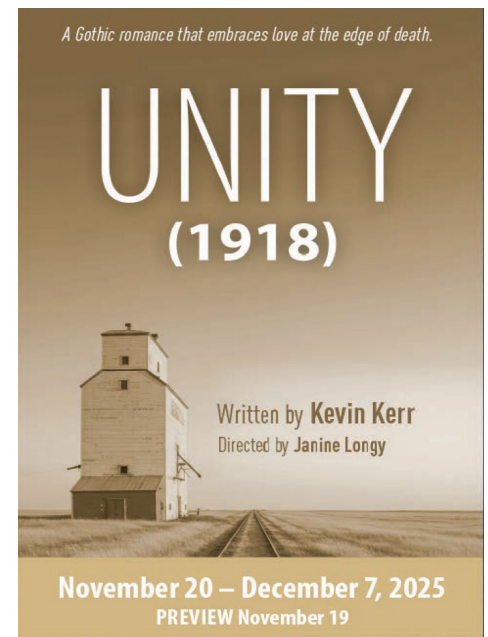
Stan – (30s-40s) A farmer who experiences hardship and loss during the play.

One of Langham's Life Members, Rick Underwood, passed away on May 27, 2025

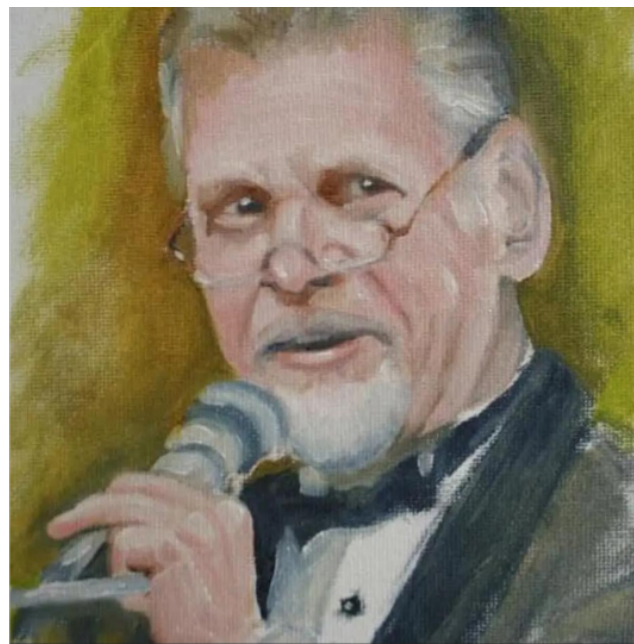

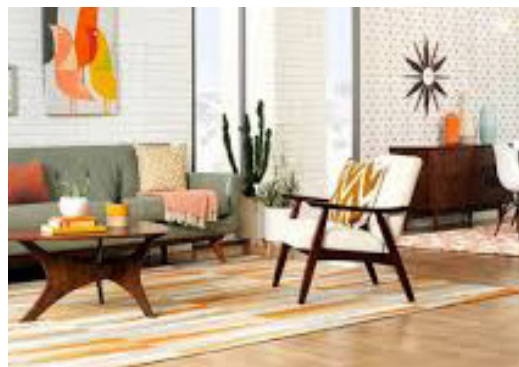

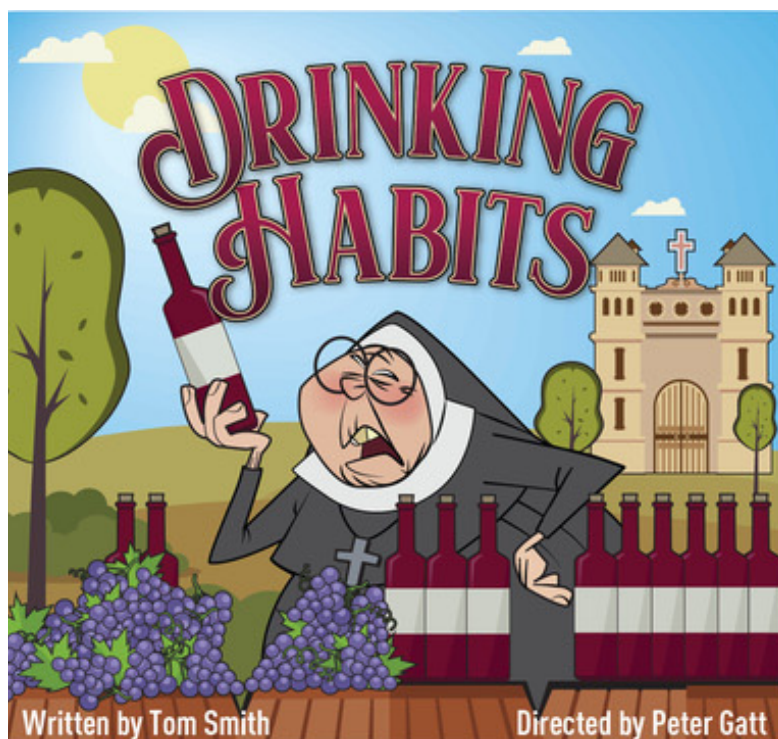
